Embroidery has played a very significant role in the lives of Indian people. It is an art which both men and women practice satisfying their creative urges as well as to earn a living. It is used to adorn everything from personal things like handkerchiefs to bed and table linen, cushion covers, curtains and apparel. A few tiny stitches in a variety of threads can magically transform a plain fabric into an artistic creation.

- Art of creating a decorative effect on the surface of the fabric
- Needle and thread are used to embroider a design
- It can be described as a painting with a needle

All about Embroidery Needles

- Size 1 is coarse, size 10 is very fine
- Fine needles for delicate fabrics, coarse needles for thick fabrics
- The thickness of needle more than a sewing thread
- Sharp tip essential to allow free movement in and out of the fabric
- Curved or rusty needles to be avoided
- Needles to be stored in a case

What is Important to Know

Equipment needed for Embroidery

- 1. Thimble
- Used to protect the finger
- Small, lightweight, metallic
- Worn on the middle finger

2. Scissors

- Embroidery scissors small in size
- Have sharp, narrow, pointed blades
- Used to cut and neaten the loose ends of the thread
- Clippers can be used as an alternative
- Scissors to be kept in a case or sheath

3. Threads for Embroidery

- Different kinds of threads used for different embroideries
- Can be cotton, silk, wool or synthetic
- Can have more or less twist
- Some threads are available in ply
- 1 ply for fine embroidery and 6 plies for bold embroidery

4. Embroidery Frames

- Frames are used to hold the fabric tightly and evenly
- Helps to embroider evenly and neatly
- Two types: Round and Rectangular
- Frames are either of wood or metal

5. Fabric

• Embroidery can be done on any fabric
