ON 15 August 1947 India became Independent from the British Empire following the Independence Movement led by Mahatma Gandhi and his message of nonviolent resistance. The handover of power was overseen by Lord Mountbatten, the last viceroy of India. Jawaharlal Nehru became the first prime and raised the Indian national flag above the Lahori Gate of the Red Fort in Delhi in honour of the celebrations.
