- 3. Freud believed that personality results from the conflict between our aggressive and pleasure-seeking impulses and instincts. Explain Freud's structure of personality.
- 4. The Ego performs the difficult duty of mediating between the demands of Id and the moral position of Superego. But it is not always possible to get a solution. What are the processes the ego uses in such cases? Explain.
- 5. Explain how trait theories of personality are different from psychoanalytic theories of personality.
- 6. In the previous lesson, we talked about self-efficacy. Explain how Albert Bandura's personality theory has included self-efficacy into it.
- 7. A psychologist follows a humanistic approach. What are the assumptions that can be formulated by the given information? Support your answer with reasons.
